What is CERT?

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

How Do I Register For Training?

Fremont Township will provide Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) in a series of six Tuesday evening sessions at the Fremont Township Center. **Classes will meet at 7:00 p.m. on May 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th and June 1st and 8th. Class materials and equipment are provided free to residents through grant funds provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Enrollment is limited to individuals 18 years of age or older, or teens age 16 and 17 with a signed permission slip and waiver from their parents. Individuals who complete the course will receive a certificate of completion from the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). High School and college students seeking community volunteer hours will also be provided with a letter of completion for their school file.**

The training program is 20 hours long and is divided into six training sessions on the following topics: Disaster Preparedness, Disaster Fire Suppression, Disaster Medical Operations Parts 1 & 2, Light Search and Rescue Operations, and Disaster Psychology and Team Organization. Upon completion of the 20 hour training session, individuals are encouraged to participate in a simulated disaster drill at the Countryside Fire Station on Midlothian Rd. in Mundelein.

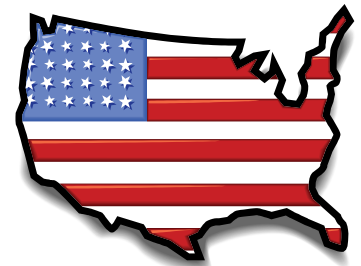


WELL & WATER COMMITTEE

2010 CENSUS - STAND UP AND BE COUNTED

Every year, the United States government distributes more than \$400 billion to states and communities based on census data. Within Lake County and the cities and villages, data collected in the Census aids in making decisions that guide economic development and help determine priorities for infrastructure, such as schools, roads, and sewers.



In March 2010, every household in Lake County will receive the 2010 Census form in the mail. This form has 10 questions on it and will take about 10 minutes to fill out. The household and individual information is completely confidential and protected by law. It cannot be given to any other government office, including law enforcement agencies.

Please fill out the form when it arrives at your residence and mail it back in.
Your response is needed in order for Lake County to get additional funds.
